We recommend headphones or external speakers if you are watching on a laptop/computer or tablet (not the internal laptop speakers, these often don't produce enough sound).

*The Children, Young Persons and their Families (Oranga Tamariki) Legislation Act 2017 comes fully into force on 1 July 2019. The amendments constitute the most significant changes since the original 1989 Act.
