- Te Tiriti o Waitangi, and some misunderstandings that have emerged from our history.
- Effective and correct engagement methods with whānau, hapū, Iwi and hāpori Māori.
- Enabling participants to navigate confidently in te Ao Māori environments while recognising and respecting the unique identity and culture of te iwi Māori in Aotearoa.
- Implementing all the course teachings to create enduring and successful relationships with Māori in the law.
