David Goddard QC has a wide ranging commercial litigation and law reform practice, with an emphasis on competition law and market regulation, company law, contract law, public law and international law. He studied law at Victoria University and Oxford University, then taught law at Bristol University for two years before returning to New Zealand. He worked at Chapman Tripp from 1988 to 1998, then began practice as a barrister sole in 1999. David was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2003.

David publishes and speaks extensively in his areas of specialisation. Since returning to New Zealand, he has taught part-time at universities in New Zealand and Australia. David is the moderator of the contract law papers of the New Zealand universities, appointed by the Council of Legal Education. He has presented seminars for the NZLS on Private International Law, Company Law, Developments in the Law of Obligations, Deception in Commercial Dealings and Drafting Better Court Documents.
